

7th GERN Summer School on “Emerging Trends in Criminology”

School of Criminology, Faculty of Law, University of Porto

To be held at the Faculty of Law, University of Porto

9 - 11 September

Theme

The Summer School, to be held at the School of Criminology of the University of Porto, will be dedicated to the theme “Emerging Trends in Criminology”. Students will be challenged to think of new problems to be tackled within Criminology, or to incorporate new methodologies to solve old problems.

The invited lecturers will hopefully present studies with new fields and methods, that they may incorporate in their research projects, or that will broaden and complement their knowledge of the field.

Aim

The Summer School is aimed at PhD students (preferably) in their second or third year of doctoral studies on deviance, crime and social control developing their project in a GERN member institution, and who intend to present and discuss their work among peers, and debate it with leading European researchers in Criminology. Post-doctoral researchers may also apply.

This is an opportunity to present your research, have it discussed by leading European researchers and, if selected, published in an edited and peer-reviewed volume.

The Summer School includes

- Presentations of the work by the doctoral the students
- Feedback from peers and senior researchers
- Plenary lectures on emerging topics and methods in criminology
- Opportunity to publish the research paper on the Sumer School proceedings

What does it involve?

Doctoral students will need to send a detailed abstract of their paper (two pages setting out their theoretical framework, concepts and research findings/research plans), together with a letter of engagement from their supervisor, agreeing to support them, by 12th April 2019. We

can admit up to about 20 students – initial acceptance will be made known by the 15th May 2019.

Those students who have been initially accepted will need to send their paper to be discussed at the summer school, of some 6,000 words (in English) by 28th June 2019 and final acceptance will be on receipt of the paper.

What does it cost?

Students (or their institutions) will need to bear the cost of their own travel and accommodation to Porto. The organisers will provide advice for affordable accommodation whenever possible.

The cost of the conference will be 60€ for students whose institution is member of GERN (and 140€ for students whose institution is not a member of GERN). This will include tea and coffee, lunches, an informal dinner for all the participants and a copy of the forthcoming volume from the Summer School.
